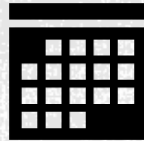
Commit to the following to help you in making your choices.

THE QUALIFICATION LEVELS

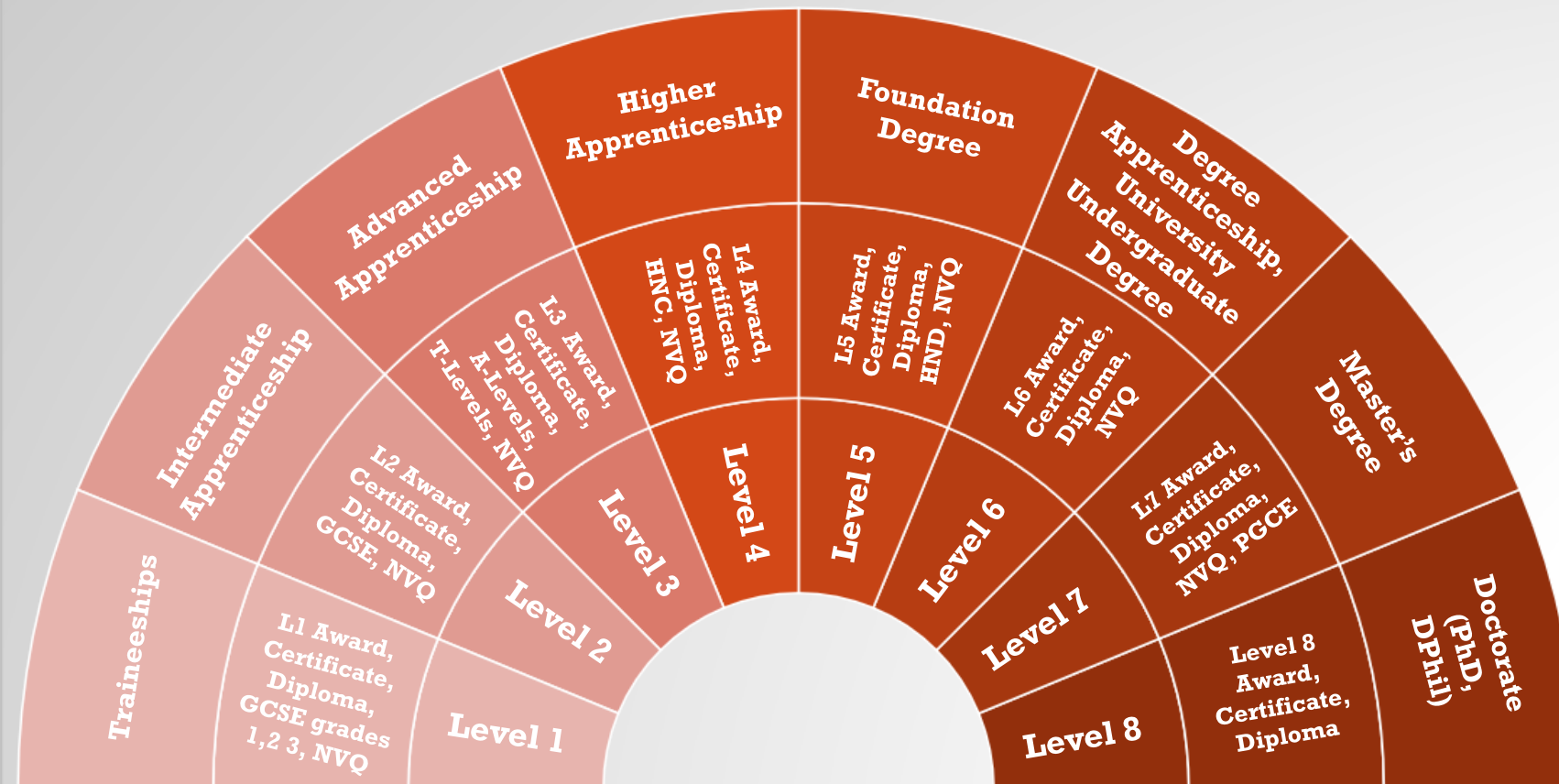
The subjects that you are selecting from are Level 2 courses.





A passing grade in four or more Level 2 courses usually opens up progression onto Level 3 courses.



