The first half term

We had a very positive first half term to this academic year. Our new Year 7 and Year 12 cohorts have made a smooth transition and are already contributing new ideas to the school community. A number of extra-curricular projects — including our Sister Act production, Donmar Warehouse project and Police Cadets programme — are up and running and well attended. A new partnership with the Sufra Food Bank has seen regular and generous donations from students, and also led to more families accessing the support they need. Educational visits have gone out to a range of destinations, including Google Headquarters at Kings Cross. Finally, we have hosted a number of very well-attended parent/carer information events, strengthening the partnership that lies at the heart of educational achievement.

Dealing with current events

At the same time, there have been a number of news stories that have created significant levels of worry and upset. The earthquake in Morocco, flooding in Libya, stabbing in Croydon and recent events in Palestine and Israel all provide examples of events that have deeply affected members of our school community. We have worked hard to closely monitor individual students and provide personalised support when needed. We have also engaged with outside agencies to access expert guidance; as an example, Solutions not Sides will be delivering a series of workshops over the coming months.
