Year 11 Examinations & Study Arrangements until the End of Year

Dear Parents/Carers/Students

We are writing to inform you of important information and arrangements for our Year 11 cohort as they embark upon the Summer Examinations season. Obviously, this is an incredibly important and potentially stressful time for our students. It will require focus and determination to succeed as well as all our support.

As you will be aware, the formal examination season starts on Monday 15th May 2017 and will last, for some, until towards the end of June. Please find below some important and necessary information regarding the examinations and the support being offered throughout this time.

Attendance Arrangements & School Day

During the exam period, students will attend school as usual, attending registration and lessons, when they are not in exams. Students must get their attendance mark with their form tutors in the morning and if they have a morning examination they will then come down to the examination hall (Sports Hall) and line up outside for an orderly entrance to the hall in the usual way. Students are aware of these procedures from Pre-Public Examination weeks. When not in an examination, their subject teachers will be in lessons ready to help with revision. If their subject has already been examined, their class teacher will facilitate revision of examinations still to happen and students should bring revision with them to their lessons - they have plenty! Every minute counts and this is a useful and productive period of time for examination preparation - successful schools support students through the examination season and research shows results are better because of it!

Students are expected to attend both examinations and lessons in full school uniform. Failure to do so may result in alternative examination arrangements being necessary. Please consult students' individual Examination Timetables for dates/times.

Please note, as with previous years, the school lunch break will be moved to between Periods 3 & 4 1220 to 1300 from Monday 15th May 2017 for a period of at least 4 school weeks to facilitate the prompt start of afternoon examinations.

What to Bring to Exams

Full pencil case (pens, pencils, ruler, eraser, sharpener, Maths equipment e.g. calculator, protractor) Water (no other drinks are permitted and water must be in an un-labelled bottle) **Revision materials** for before the exam

Pre-Exam Study Space

Each morning the Dining Room will be open from 7:30am for students to study quietly before the day's examinations. Relevant teachers for the examinations will be on hand to help with last minute

































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questions and concerns. Water and a breakfast bar or "brain snack" will be available for those wishing to eat and drink sensibly before their examinations within this study area.

After School Revision

After School Revision sessions will continue as per the current schedule. Students should attend at the allotted times to maximise their learning potential.

Saturday School & Half-term Revision School

Saturday School will run as usual throughout the examination season. **May Half-term School** will again have a full programme of revision sessions from **Tuesday 30th May until Friday 2nd June 2017**. A further letter will detail these aspects in due course.

Examination Rules

The Examinations Office has previously sent these out to you along with the examination timetables. Please emphasise the importance of **preparation and revision** to students at this time. In particular, encourage students to get into school in plenty of time and to check the pre-posted **seating plans** (outside the examinations hall) so the beginning of examinations are not rushed and stressful.

Please also find attached a reminder about the GCSEpod resource we have in school that can help with revision at home and the examination tips which students and parents may find useful.

Further details regarding the end of year Prom and Graduation Assembly will be sent out in the near future.
