Welcome to the Year 9 Choices Booklet – a key moment in the journey for the Class of 2027.




We ask our students to Think Big, and this is great example of an opportunity to think beyond the immediate and consider a very exciting future.

# THE QUALIFICATION LEVELS

The subjects that you are selecting from are Level 2 courses.

A passing grade in four or more Level 2 courses usually opens up progression onto Level 3 courses.

(PGCE stands for the Post Graduate Certificate in Education. Every single one of your teachers has attained a Level 6 qualification, the vast majority have continued to Level 7 and some have even reached Level 8. Your teachers really know how to learn!)

French and Spanish




You will either continue your studies of French or Spanish into KS4 or choose between Geography or History.

## THE RECOMMENDED CHOICE




If you have been recommended to study French or Spanish you are also able to choose from Geography, History or a second language as your free choices.
