Coronavirus COVID-19 Examination Update for GCSE, BTEC and A level students

Again, I hope this letter finds you healthy and well.

Today, Ofqual have published a statement on the process for determining grades, as I informed you they would in my earlier letter this week:

Obviously, we are still digesting the details of this information but it seems to be very much along the lines that I detailed, previously. The key points being:

- Exact details for submitting grades will be sent to schools after the Easter break via individual examination boards
- They will use a range of evidence
- There will be a method for national standardisation of the grades submitted
- The deadline for submission will have a deadline not earlier than 29 May 2020
- There is still some discussion regarding vocational subjects to be decided
- Grades will be published to students not later than the usual time in August and preferably slightly before (end of July) to promote certainty to students
- We **cannot** under any circumstances disclose to students the grades that teachers submit so please do not contact teachers concerning this

Can I repeat my guidance at the end of my previous letter concerning students completing set work to the best of their abilities for the reasons detailed there; nearly all those reasons

Furthermore, I completely sympathise with all students' concerns. Hopefully, this announcement goes someway to reassuring everyone of the process going forward. Again, please trust us to do the best for each student, holistically, and please refrain from contacting individual members of staff to request specific grades in specific subjects awarded. This is could potentially jeopardise the integrity of the process of grade determination.



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As always, I will keep you informed when/if more information becomes available. I will be digesting the finer detail of the announcement today over Easter and can be contacted by email if you or your child has any further significant concerns.

May I take this opportunity to wish you a happy and as normal an Easter break as possible and hope you all stay safe.
