Dear Parents and Carers

Unbelievably, we find ourselves at the end of this academic year. The last few months have gone by in a bit of a blur. I am sure you all feel the same. Thank you all for your continued support over this time. It has been lovely to welcome Year 10 and Year 12 over the past month, and I write this as they are leaving the building for the last time this year. Whilst the return to school may have seemed quite daunting, we have seen that as soon as students are back they are quickly reassured and settle back into a routine.

You will know that the government has published its guidance on the full-reopening of schools (https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/actions-for-schools-during-the-coronavirusoutbreak/guidance-for-full-opening-schools).

Whilst the guidance represents a logistical challenge for us, we are delighted that we will be welcoming all of our students back to school full-time in September. Although we are aware that some pupils have really enjoyed the opportunity to learn independently, others are really lacking a direction, especially after what will have been 5½ months away from school. Consequently, getting students back to a more structured routine of learning is so important. I would strongly encourage all students to look at this and enrol for this free, safe and supportive activity

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We break up officially on Tuesday 21 July at 1230.
