Dear Parent/Carer,

This is the final update of my first year as Head at Hampstead School. Thank you for the support, understanding, resilience and flexibility that you have demonstrated over the past eleven months; it has made a huge difference. Students and staff have mirrored these qualities and, in combination, this has made it possible to continue offering a broad and balanced curriculum despite the limitations and instability created by the COVID-19 pandemic.

These qualities were displayed clearly in our recent Sports Days, rearranged following the spike in cases at a local and national level. Students enjoyed a series of sports mornings, engaging brilliantly in high-participation team games. It was a good example of the circumstances forcing creative innovation; this modified event was such a hit that we hope to repeat it on a termly basis next year.

We have held celebration and end-of-term assemblies with all year groups over the past two weeks. In these assemblies we have reflected on the past eighteen months; it has been a struggle for all of us but I know that it has affected some more than others. We took time to think about those who have suffered financial hardship, struggled with the physical effects of the virus or lost loved ones. At the same time, we looked forward to a new year with a sense of possibility and opportunity.

Seize the Summer

There are a wide range of high quality activities that students can access over the summer break, but we thought we would pick out two particularly exciting options here.

The Fuzion Academy is taking place at Hampstead School for four of the five weeks that make up the holiday period. Aimed at 11-16 year olds, it offers a wide range of fun-filled activities including sport, cooking workshops, music workshops, arts and crafts, numeracy and literacy support and design technology.

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It is free of charge and includes a free lunchtime meal. Please note that Fuzion Academy is independent of the school; we are not responsible for the quality of provision on this programme.
