Dear Parent/Carer

I hope this letter finds you and your loved ones safe and well.

In the time since I last wrote, London has moved into Tier 4 and the government has announced a staggered start to the beginning of term and a mass testing programme in schools. We continue to face uncertainty but I hope to give some clarity with the information below.

Confirmed case update

We saw an increase in confirmed cases in the days following the end of term. 27 positive COVID-19 results (14 staff and 13 students) were reported between December 18th and December 26th. In each case we ran a risk assessment and put in place track and trace procedures, contacting students and staff who may have been in close contact with a confirmed case. I would like to thank the team of staff involved, and wish all those affected a speedy recovery.

This sharp increase was concerning and in response I took advice from Camden and Islington Public Health. They had seen similar case numbers across schools and attributed much of it to the exponential growth seen in the South East in recent weeks, with potential links to the new strain. With their support we revisited our risk assessment and will be emphasising the key themes with staff and students on our return in January.

Arrangements for the start of term

Increasing case numbers have led to the government announcing a staggered start to the new term. This will help break transmission chains originating from social contact over Christmas and will also allow schools to set up testing programmes.

Remote learning expectations

From Tuesday 5th January, all students will be expected to follow the remote curriculum provided through Microsoft Teams. The structure will be much like our recent Teams Day; lessons will be uploaded as per the normal timetable and teaching staff will be available to give live support and guidance.

Students eligible for in-school provision

A small number of students are eligible for in-school provision from Tuesday 5th January.

• If you are classed as a critical worker (definition <u>here</u>) you can choose to send your child in to school where we will provide a supervised work space and IT access.

• If your child is classed as being in a vulnerable group (definition <u>here</u>) our pastoral and Achievement Support teams will contact you on 4th January to discuss in-school provision. If you believe your child is in this category and you are not contacted, please let us know.

Testing programme

The government announced on December 17th that they aim to roll out a mass testing programme in secondary schools at the beginning of January. We have been working with Camden Local Authority and the DfE over the Christmas break to put this in place.

The first wave of testing would include all staff, students in Years 11 and 13 and any critical worker or vulnerable students taking up the offer of in-school provision.

We will contact these groups via email with further detail, and information on how to give consent, on Monday 4th January.

Thank you for your patience and support; we are responding to ever-changing guidance and will continue to keep you informed.
