

GLOBAL RECYCLING DAY


To celebrate Global Recycling Day on 18 March 2022 we were joined by the education team of Veolia UK for a morning of activities in and around our school. The day begun with an assembly for Year 7 students



about the importance of recycling. Students were reminded of how recycling enables us to reduce our use of natural resources and several links were drawn to their studies of sustainability and climate change in geography.

Following the assembly, the Student Leadership Council went

into the local area to complete a litter pick. A huge amount of rubbish and recyclable material was collected from the surrounding streets and made a noticeable difference, particularly to the wildflower patch on Westbere Road. Staff and



students commented on how enjoyable it was to their positive impact and it's an activity they would like to repeat again soon.
