Dance Journeys: *REFRESH\\RESET* takes inspiration from English National Ballet's Spring triple bill, <u>Bausch /</u> <u>Forsythe / Van Manen</u>. The Dance Journeys Company of 100 dancers are accompanied by young musicians from the Royal College of Music Juniors programme, who bring to life an exciting new score composed by Thomas Hewitt-Jones.



Over the past 12 weeks, each school has worked independently with a choreographer from the English National Ballet to develop their own creative response to the themes of the triple bill. The work has been brought together over two full rehearsals at the English National Ballet's London home to create a powerful performance piece.

The special matinee programme also featured performances by Dance Journeys Company, ENBYouthCo, English National Ballet School, and English National Ballet performing William Forsythe's <u>In the Middle, Somewhat Elevated</u>, followed by a Q&A hosted by Donald Hutera.

HOLOCAST MEMORIAL DAY CEREMONY Nedae E, Year 10

On 23rd of January, my fellow classmate Dounia and I along with our History teacher, Miss Kempner, went on a trip to The Chamber, City Hall to commemorate Holocaust Memorial Day where their key question this year was 'How can life go on?'. We entered City Hall through a metal detector, got our name tags and were directed to our seats. Many other people arrived, most of whom were elderly, some of whom were Holocaust survivors or relatives of those who were caught in the dreadful event of the Holocaust.

It was unusual yet fascinating, to be in a room with people that had gone through such events and to hear their stories. For example Mala Tribich MBE, who is one of the few still living, Holocaust survivors – it was so touching hearing about what had happened to her and her family, which was really interesting. We also heard a testimonial from Sokphal Din, survivor of the Genocide in Cambodia. His story was extremely touching as he talked about how he lost his family members, one by one at such a young age. The Mayor of London, Sidiq Khan, also contributed to the memorial to commemorate all those who were lost in the Holocaust.

The whole day was a success as it was a new experience for me. We were the last generation to be able to hear the Holocaust survivors' stories in person so it was special. It was able to get the point across of making sure that history does not repeat itself and to value those who have risked their lives to rescue and protect victims.

A heart-warmingly memorable moment from the whole experience was the final sitting, where all countries and committees sat together to build solutions towards a more prosperous, socially progressive and most of all peaceful world. A world peace proposal and apology was made by Israel to Palestine.

Hampstead School's North Korea won first place for best delegation with a celebratory plaque and immense glory. Israel also received an honourable mention. Well done to Charlie M, Year 12 for winning best delegate in his committee, and to Eliot T, Year 11, Adam Z, Year 10 for honourable mentions.

This is the third time a delegation from Hampstead School has won the coveted Gold. Many hours of practice and research went into making every point articulated eloquently to perfection for the weekend. It's safe to say Hampstead School's Debate Society has established itself as a dominant force not to be reckoned with at MUN.
