If you are joining us in September you can access SMHW here

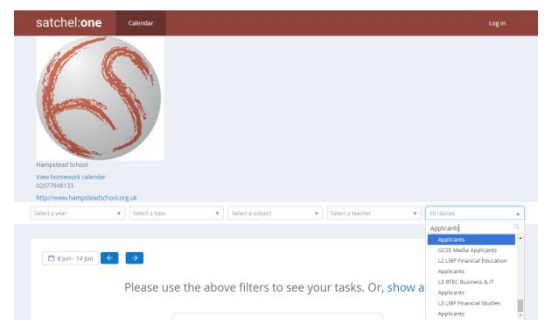
